**COLLECTION REPORT FROM TREASURER  
AS OF APRIL 18, 2014**

The delinquent tax amount for the City of Franklin is \$445,917.94. This reflects tax years 2012 and older. The last report from the Treasurer was on October 01, 2013. The total amount delinquent on that date was \$612,059.72 showing a reduced amount in delinquent taxes of \$166,141.78. Since last reporting we have billed 2013 tax year.

**REAL ESTATE:**

Currently there is \$258,634.73 in delinquent real estate taxes. Of that amount \$135,628.06 remains delinquent for tax year 2012. We currently have 60+ taxpayers on monthly payment plans and wage liens. We continue to work with Jason Dunn, Attorney at Law (Tax Attorney) out of Chesapeake VA to assist in selling properties who meet the requirements for a Tax Sale. Any property delinquent 2010 and older (not on a current payment plan) have been sent to the company. There are 40 properties currently being worked by Mr. Dunn.

**PERSONAL PROPERTY:**

Currently there is \$158,236.36 in delinquent personal property taxes. Of that amount \$47,577.06 remains delinquent from the 2012 tax year. We currently have 100+ taxpayers on payment plans and wage liens. As long as taxpayers pay as agreed with their payment plan they are not subject to any collection action. Should the taxpayer not meet the agreement without conversation with the office, their agreement becomes null and void and collection action commence. We continue to use various collections tools to assist the office in our collection efforts.

**BUSINESS LICENSE:**

Currently there is \$5,744.47 in delinquent business licenses. Of the list provided, none of the businesses are currently in business. Any business that owes personal property taxes on their business, monies being paid will be applied to personal property before being applied to the business license. We currently have 1 of these delinquent accounts even though no longer in business on a monthly payment plan.

**MEAL AND LODGING TAX**

Currently there is \$24,302.38 in delinquent meals tax and \$0.00 in lodging. There currently are 3 businesses that have delinquent meals tax and only 1 that remains open. Those businesses that have delinquent meals tax are on a payment plan with the office. To be able to be on a payment plan the business must file and pay current meals tax, and pay monthly on the delinquent tax.

**Additional Information:**

**DMV-STOP**-Since last reporting we have had 27 delinquent taxpayers satisfied with the DMV-STOP program. This program is only used as a collection tool for delinquent personal property taxes and parking tickets. Once a Stop is placed on the taxpayer, it prevents the taxpayer from renewing their licenses and registration of vehicle. We are in the process of sending the 2013 delinquent taxes to the program.

**DEBT SET-OFF**-Since last reporting we have had 37 claims and a total of \$8,633.08 applied to delinquent taxes and inactive utility accounts. This program is through the Virginia State Withholding. All taxpayers

who have delinquencies with the City of Franklin are placed in this program. Should a taxpayer receive a tax refund or lottery winnings, those funds are captured and sent to the city. We are expecting a large payment to be received on May 15<sup>th</sup>.

**VIRGINIA AUCTION COMPANY**-Since last reporting we have had 4 vehicles seizures. We will be starting the vehicle seizures in May. We sent out letters informing taxpayers of their delinquencies and giving them until April 15<sup>th</sup> to make arrangements to pay or get on a payment plan. At the time of the payment agreement, the taxpayer is aware that should they fail to meet their payment agreement without notification and agreement with the office, their vehicle will be placed back on the vehicle seizure list.

**TAX-SALE**- We have had 1 Tax Sale with Jones, Jones and Dunn since last reporting. Six properties were sold. These properties had delinquencies dating back as far as 2001. Due to the delinquent status several properties didn't sale for enough to pay delinquent taxes, nuisance liens, attorney's fees and auctioneer fees. All parties involved took a cut and wrote off the balance. We are now hopeful that they are in a paying taxpayer ownership. We will have a Tax Sale on May 08, 2014 at 10AM. There will be 2 properties sold that day.

**Additional Data:**

Since last reporting we have billed Tax Year 2013. As of March 31<sup>st</sup> we have collected 95% of the first half of Real Estate that was due December 05, 2013 and 95% of the Personal Property that was due December 05, 2013. Second half of 2013 Real Estate has been mailed and will be due June 05, 2014.

RE: **VRS Resolution for Implementation of 5.0% Member Contribution**

Senate Bill 497 of the 2012 Appropriations Act required that political and school division employees began paying the five percent member contribution to the Virginia Retirement System effective July 1, 2012. Legislation also required offsetting salary increases and an option to phase in the contribution over a five year period.

Effective July 1, 2012, the City elected to phase in the contribution over a five year period by contributing 1.0% towards the employee paid contribution and gave the mandated 1.0% salary increase (1.1% to offset taxes). The phase in election continued effective July 1, 2013. Currently, of the 5.0% member contribution to VRS, the City's pays 2.0% and the employee contributes 3.0%. The City is recommending a third year phase-in of the 5.0% contribution to VRS effective July 1, 2014.

WHEREAS, the Franklin City Council 5-5232 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members who commence or recommence employment on or after July 1, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis upon commencing or recommencing employment; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin City Council employees who are Virginia Retirement System members and in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis no later than July 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, such employees in service on June 30, 2012, shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of their creditable compensation beginning on each July 1 of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin City Council may elect to require such employees in service on June 30, 2012, to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages, until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the second enactment clause of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) requires an increase in total creditable compensation, effective July 1, 2014, to each such employee in service on June 30, 2014, to offset the cost of the member contributions, such increase in total creditable compensation to be equal to the percentage increase of the member contribution paid by such pursuant to this resolution (For example, if the member contribution paid by the employee increases from two to three percent pursuant to this resolution, the employee must receive a one percent increase in creditable compensation.)

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Franklin City Council does hereby certify to the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees that it shall effect the implementation of the member contribution requirements of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) according to the following schedule for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such contributions, although designated as member contributions, are to be made by the Franklin City Council in lieu of member contributions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pick up member contributions shall be paid from the same source of funds as used in paying the wages to affected employees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that member contributions made by the Franklin City Council under the pick up arrangement shall be treated for all purposes other than income taxation, including but not limited to VRS benefits, in the same manner and to the same extent as member contributions made prior to the pick up arrangement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be construed so as to permit or extend an option to VRS members to receive the pick up contributions made by the Franklin City Council directly instead of having them paid to VRS; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notwithstanding any contractual or other provisions, the wages of each member of VRS who is an employee of the Franklin City Council shall be reduced by the amount of member contributions picked up by the Franklin City Council on behalf of such employee pursuant to the foregoing resolutions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no salary increases provided solely to offset the cost of required member contributions to the Virginia Retirement System under § 51.1-144 of the Code of Virginia will be used to certify that any salary increases required by the Appropriation Act have been provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, the officers are hereby authorized and directed in the name of the Franklin City Council to carry out the provisions of this resolution, and said officers are authorized and directed to pay over to the Treasurer of Virginia from time to time such sums as are due to be paid by the City of Franklin, Virginia for this purpose.

Language in the 2013 Appropriations Act permitted localities to make an election regarding their employer contribution rate every biennium beginning 2012-2013. The intent of the language in the Act was to offer some budget relief with respect to retirement contributions. Effective July 1, 2014, localities are afforded the same opportunity to elect either the rate certified by VRS for the FY 2015-2016 biennium or an alternate rate, which is lower than the VRS certified rate.

Attached please find the proposed stormwater ordinance for adoption by City Council. In 2011 the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board adopted revised stormwater regulations, to be adopted by all localities in Virginia with an effective date of July 1, 2014. The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Policy Office provided the localities a model ordinance for adoption. This ordinance has been reviewed by the City's attorney for appropriateness as well as by DEQ for compliance with the requirements of the Virginia Stormwater Management Program.

**Recommended Action:** Adopt ordinance to become effective July 1, 2014



THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, VIRGINIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That Chapter 25.7 of the City of Franklin Code, known as the "Stormwater Management Ordinance", is repealed effective June 30, 2014.

That Chapter 25.8, to be known as "STORMWATER MANAGEMENT" of the City of Franklin Code is hereby adopted effective July 1, 2014, to read as follows:

**25.8-1. PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY. (Section 9VAC25-870-20, 62.1-44.15:27)**

(a) The purpose of this Ordinance is to ensure the general health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Franklin and protect the quality and quantity of state waters from the potential harm of unmanaged stormwater, including protection from a land disturbing activity causing unreasonable degradation of properties, water quality, stream channels, and other natural resources, and to establish procedures whereby stormwater requirements related to water quality and quantity shall be administered and enforced.

(b) This ordinance is adopted pursuant to Title 62.1-44.15:27 of the Code of Virginia.

**25.8-2. DEFINITIONS. (9VAC25-870-10)**

In addition to the definitions set forth in 9VAC25-870-10 of the Virginia Stormwater Management Regulations, as amended, which are expressly adopted and incorporated herein by reference, the following words and terms used in this Ordinance have the following meanings unless otherwise specified herein. Where definitions differ, those incorporated herein shall have precedence.

*"Administrator"* means the VSMP authority including the Franklin Southampton Director of Community Development. "Administrator" also includes any duly authorized agent of the Administrator.

*"Agreement in lieu of a stormwater management plan"* means a contract between the VSMP authority and the owner or permittee that specifies methods that shall be implemented to comply with the requirements of a VSMP for the construction of a single-family residence; such contract may be executed by the VSMP authority in lieu of a stormwater management plan.

*"Applicant"* means any person submitting an application for a permit or requesting issuance of a permit under this Ordinance.

*"Best management practice" or "BMP"* means schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, including both structural and nonstructural practices, maintenance procedures, and other management practices to prevent or reduce the pollution of surface waters and groundwater systems from the impacts of land-disturbing activities.

*"Common plan of development or sale"* means a contiguous area where separate and distinct construction activities may be taking place at different times on different schedules.

*"Control measure"* means any best management practice or stormwater facility, or other method used to minimize the discharge of pollutants to state waters.

*"Clean Water Act" or "CWA"* means the federal Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C §1251 et seq.), formerly referred to as the Federal Water Pollution Control Act or Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972, Public Law 92-500, as amended by Public Law 95-217, Public Law 95-576, Public Law 96-483, and Public Law 97-117, or any subsequent revisions thereto.

*"Department"* means the Department of Environmental Quality.

*"Development"* means land disturbance and the resulting landform associated with the construction of residential, commercial, industrial, institutional, recreation, transportation or utility facilities or structures or the clearing of land for non-agricultural or non-silvicultural purposes.

*"General permit"* means the state permit titled GENERAL PERMIT FOR DISCHARGES OF STORMWATER FROM CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES found in Part XIV (9VAC25-880 et seq.) of the Regulations authorizing a category of discharges under the CWA and the Act within a geographical area of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

*"Land disturbance" or "land-disturbing activity"* means a man-made change to the land surface that potentially changes its runoff characteristics including clearing, grading, or excavation except that the term shall not include those exemptions specified in Section 25.8-3 (b) of this Ordinance.

*"Layout"* means a conceptual drawing sufficient to provide for the specified stormwater management facilities required at the time of approval.

*"Minor modification"* means an amendment to an existing general permit before its expiration not requiring extensive review and evaluation including, but not limited to, changes in EPA promulgated test protocols, increasing monitoring frequency requirements, changes in sampling locations, and changes to compliance dates within the overall compliance schedules. A minor general permit modification or amendment does not substantially alter general permit conditions, substantially increase or decrease the amount of surface water impacts, increase the size of the operation, or reduce the capacity of the facility to protect human health or the environment.

*"Operator"* means the owner or operator of any facility or activity subject to regulation under this Ordinance.

*"Permit" or "VSMP Authority Permit"* means an approval to conduct a land-disturbing activity issued by the Administrator for the initiation of a land-disturbing activity, in accordance with this Ordinance, and which may only be issued after evidence of general permit coverage has been provided by the Department.

*"Permittee"* means the person to whom the VSMP Authority Permit is issued.

*"Person"* means any individual, corporation, partnership, association, state, municipality, commission, or political subdivision of a state, governmental body, including federal, state, or local entity as applicable, any interstate body or any other legal entity.

*"Regulations"* means the Virginia Stormwater Management Program (VSMP) Permit Regulations, 9VAC25-870 of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

*"Site"* means the land or water area where any facility or land-disturbing activity is physically located or conducted, including adjacent land used or preserved in connection with the facility or land-disturbing activity. Areas channelward of mean low water in tidal Virginia shall not be considered part of a site.

*"State"* means the Commonwealth of Virginia.

*"State Board"* means the Virginia State Water Control Board.

*"State permit"* means an approval to conduct a land-disturbing activity issued by the State Board in the form of a state stormwater individual permit or coverage issued under a state general permit or an approval issued by the State Board for stormwater discharges from an MS4. Under these state permits, the Commonwealth imposes and enforces requirements pursuant to the federal Clean Water Act and regulations, the Virginia Stormwater Management Act and the Regulations.

*"State Water Control Law"* means Chapter 3.1(Section 62.1-44.2 et seq) of Title 62.1 of the Code of Virginia.

*"State waters"* means all water, on the surface and under the ground, wholly or partially within or bordering the Commonwealth or within its jurisdiction, including wetlands.

*"Stormwater"* means precipitation that is discharged across the land surface or through conveyances to one or more waterways and that may include stormwater runoff, snow melt runoff, and surface runoff and drainage.

*"Stormwater management plan"* means a document(s) containing material describing methods for complying with the requirements of Section 25.8-6 of this Ordinance.

*"Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan" or "SWPPP"* means a document that is prepared in accordance with good engineering practices and that identifies potential sources of pollutants that may reasonably be expected to affect the quality of stormwater discharges from the construction site, and otherwise meets the requirements of this Ordinance. In addition the document shall identify and require the implementation of control measures, and shall include, but not be limited to the inclusion of, or the incorporation by reference of, an approved erosion and sediment control plan, an approved stormwater management plan, and a pollution prevention plan.

*"Subdivision"* means the same as defined in Appendix C of the City of Franklin Municipal Code.

*"Total maximum daily load" or "TMDL"* means the sum of the individual wasteload allocations for point sources, load allocations for nonpoint sources, natural background loading and a margin of safety. TMDLs can be expressed in terms of either mass per time, toxicity, or other appropriate measure. The TMDL process provides for point versus nonpoint source trade-offs.

*"Virginia Stormwater Management Act" or "Act"* means Article 2.3 (Section 62.1-44.15:24 et seq) of Chapter 3.1 of the Code of Virginia.

*"Virginia Stormwater BMP Clearinghouse website"* means a website that contains detailed design standards and specifications for control measures that may be used in Virginia to comply with the requirements of the Virginia Stormwater Management Act and associated regulations.

*"Virginia Stormwater Management Program" or "VSMP"* means a program approved by the State Board after September 13, 2011, that has been established by a locality to manage the quality and quantity of runoff resulting from land-disturbing activities and shall include such items as local ordinances, rules, permit requirements, annual standards and specifications, policies and guidelines, technical materials, and requirements for plan review, inspection, enforcement, where authorized in this article, and evaluation consistent with the requirements of this article and associated regulations.

*"Virginia Stormwater Management Program authority" or "VSMP authority"* means an authority approved by the State Board after September 13, 2011, to operate a Virginia Stormwater Management Program.

#### **Sec. 25.8-3. - STORMWATER PERMIT REQUIREMENT; EXEMPTIONS.**

- (a) . A person shall not conduct any land-disturbing activity until he has submitted a permit application to the VSMP authority that includes a state VSMP permit registration statement and, after July 1, 2014, a stormwater management plan, and has obtained VSMP authority approval to begin land disturbance. Upon the development of an online reporting system by the Department, but no later than July 1, 2014, a VSMP authority shall be required to obtain evidence of VSMP permit coverage where it is required prior to providing approval to begin land disturbance. The VSMP authority shall act on any permit application within 60 days after it has been determined by the VSMP authority to be a complete application. The VSMP authority may either issue project approval or denial and shall provide written rationale for the denial. The VSMP authority shall act on any permit application that has been previously disapproved within 45 days after the application has been revised, resubmitted for approval, and deemed complete. Prior to issuance of any approval, the VSMP authority may also require an applicant, excluding state and federal entities, to submit a reasonable performance bond with surety, cash escrow, letter of credit, any combination thereof, or such other legal arrangement acceptable to the VSMP authority, to ensure that measures could be taken by the VSMP authority at the applicant's expense should he fail, after proper notice, within the time specified to initiate or maintain appropriate actions that may be required of him by the permit conditions as a result of his land-disturbing activity. If the VSMP authority takes such action upon such failure by the applicant, the VSMP authority may collect from the

applicant the difference should the amount of the reasonable cost of such action exceed the amount of the security held. Within 60 days of the completion of the requirements of the permit conditions, such bond, cash escrow, letter of credit, or other legal arrangement, or the unexpended or unobligated portion thereof, shall be refunded to the applicant or terminated. These requirements are in addition to all other provisions of law relating to the issuance of permits and are not intended to otherwise affect the requirements for such permits.

- (b) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Ordinance, the following activities are exempt per 62.1-44.15:34C of the Code of Virginia, unless otherwise required by federal law:
- (1) Permitted surface or deep mining operations and projects, or oil and gas operations and projects conducted under the provisions of Title 45.1 of the Code of Virginia;
  - (2) Clearing of lands specifically for agricultural purposes and the management, tilling, planting, or harvesting of agricultural, horticultural, or forest crops, livestock feedlot operations, or as additionally set forth by the Board in regulations, including engineering operations as follows: construction of terraces, terrace outlets, check dams, desilting basins, dikes, ponds, ditches, strip cropping, lister furrowing, contour cultivating, contour furrowing, land drainage, and land irrigation; however, this exception shall not apply to harvesting of forest crops unless the area on which harvesting occurs is reforested artificially or naturally in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 11 (§ 10.1-1100 et seq.) or is converted to bona fide agricultural or improved pasture use as described in Subsection B of § 10.1-1163;
  - (3) Single-family residences separately built and disturbing less than one (1) acre and not part of a larger common plan of development or sale, including additions or modifications to existing single-family detached residential structures;
  - (4) Land disturbing activities that disturb less than one (1) acre of land area except for activities that are part of a larger common plan of development or sale that is one (1) acre or greater of disturbance ;
  - (5) Discharges to a sanitary sewer or a combined sewer system;
  - (6) Activities under a State or federal reclamation program to return an abandoned property to an agricultural or open land use;
  - (7) Routine maintenance that is performed to maintain the original line and grade, hydraulic capacity, or original construction of the project. The paving of an existing road with a compacted or impervious surface and reestablishment of existing associated ditches and shoulders shall be deemed routine maintenance if performed in accordance with this Subsection; and
  - (8) Conducting land-disturbing activities in response to a public emergency where the related work requires immediate authorization to avoid imminent endangerment to human health or the environment. In such situations, the Administrator shall be

advised of the disturbance within seven days of commencing the land-disturbing activity and compliance with the administrative requirements of Subsection (a) is required within 30 days of commencing the land-disturbing activity.

**Sec. 25.8-4. - STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED;  
SUBMISSION AND APPROVAL OF PLANS; PROHIBITIONS.**

- (a) Pursuant to § 62.1-44.15:34, 9VAC25-870-54.A-C, and 9VAC25-870-59 of the Code of Virginia, the City of Franklin hereby establishes a Virginia stormwater management program for land-disturbing activities and adopts the applicable Regulations that specify standards and specifications for VSMP's promulgated by the State Board for the purposes set out in Section 25.8-1 of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby designates the Franklin Southampton Director of Community Development as the Administrator of the Virginia stormwater management program.
- (b) No VSMP authority permit shall be issued by the Administrator, until the following items have been submitted to and approved by the Administrator as prescribed herein:
  - (1) A permit application that includes a general permit registration statement, however a registration statement is not required for detached single-family home construction within or outside of common plan of development or sale, but all such projects must adhere to the requirements of the general permit;
  - (2) An erosion and sediment control plan approved in accordance with the City of Franklin Erosion and Sediment Control Ordinance, Municipal Code Chapter 9; and
  - (3) A stormwater management plan that meets the requirements of Section 25.8-6 of this Ordinance.
- (c) No VSMP authority permit shall be issued until evidence of general permit coverage is obtained, per 62.1-44.15:34 of the Code of Virginia.
- (d) No VSMP authority permit shall be issued until the fees required to be paid pursuant to Section 25.8-15, are received, and a reasonable performance bond required pursuant to Section 25.8-16 of this Ordinance has been submitted, per 9VAC25-870-700 et seq. of the Code of Virginia.
- (e) No VSMP authority permit shall be issued unless and until the permit application and attendant materials and supporting documentation demonstrate that all land clearing, construction, disturbance, land development and drainage will be done according to the approved permit, per 62.1-44.15:34A of the Code of Virginia.
- (f) No grading, building or other local permit shall be issued for a property unless a VSMP authority permit has been issued by the Administrator, per 62.1-44.15:34A.

**Sec. 25.8-5. - STORMWATER POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN; CONTENTS OF  
PLANS.**

- (a) The Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) shall include the content specified by Section 9VAC25-870-54 and must also comply with the requirements and general information set forth in Section 9VAC25-880-70, Section II [stormwater pollution prevention plan] of the general permit.
- (b) The SWPPP shall be amended by the operator whenever there is a change in design, construction, operation, or maintenance that has a significant effect on the discharge of pollutants to state waters which is not addressed by the existing SWPPP, per 9VAC25-870-54.G of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) The SWPPP must be maintained by the operator at a central location onsite. If an onsite location is unavailable, notice of the SWPPP's location must be posted near the main entrance at the construction site, per 9VAC25-870-54.G of the Code of Virginia. Operators shall make the SWPPP available for public review in accordance with Section II of the general permit, either electronically or in hard copy.

**Sec. 25.8-6. - STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN; CONTENTS OF PLAN.**

- (a) A stormwater management plan shall be developed and submitted to the VSMP authority. The stormwater management plan shall be implemented as approved or modified by the VSMP authority and shall be developed in accordance with the following, per 9VAC25-870-55A of the Code of Virginia. A stormwater management plan for a land disturbing activity shall apply the stormwater management technical criteria set forth in this part to the entire land disturbing activity. Individual lots in new residential, commercial, or industrial developments shall not be considered separate land-disturbing activities. A stormwater management plan shall consider all sources of groundwater flows converted to surface runoff and all sources of subsurface and groundwater flows converted to surface runoff. A stormwater management plan shall include the following information:
  - (1) Information on the type and location of stormwater discharges, information on the features to which stormwater is being discharged including surface waters or karst features, if present, and the predevelopment and postdevelopment drainage areas;
  - (2) Contact information including the name, address, and telephone number of the owner and the tax reference number and parcel number of the property or properties affected;
  - (3) A narrative that includes a description of current site conditions and final site conditions, or if allowed by the VSMP authority, the information provided and documented during the review process that addresses the current and final site conditions;
  - (4) A general description of the proposed stormwater management facilities and the mechanism through which the facilities will be operated and maintained after construction is complete;
  - (5) Information on the proposed stormwater management facilities, including:

- (i) The type of facilities;
  - (ii) Location, including geographic coordinates;
  - (iii) Acres treated; and
  - (iv) The surface waters or karst features, if present, into which the facility will discharge.
- (6) Hydrologic and hydraulic computations, including runoff characteristics;
- (7) Documentation and calculations verifying compliance with the water quality and quantity requirements of the regulations.
- (8) A map or maps of the site that depicts the topography of the site and includes:
  - (i) All contributing drainage areas;
  - (ii) Existing streams, ponds, culverts, ditches, wetlands, other water bodies, and floodplains;
  - (iii) Soil types, geologic formations if karst features are present in the area, forest cover, and other vegetative areas;
  - (iv) Current land use including existing structures, roads, and locations of known utilities and easements;
  - (v) Sufficient information on adjoining parcels to assess the impacts of stormwater from the site on these parcels;
  - (vi) The limits of clearing and grading, and the proposed drainage patterns on the site;
  - (vii) Proposed buildings, roads, parking areas, utilities, and stormwater management facilities; and
  - (viii) Proposed land use with tabulation of the percentage of surface area to be adapted to various uses, including but not limited to planned locations of utilities, roads, and easements.
- (b) If an operator intends to meet the water quality and/or quantity requirements set forth in Section 25.8-9 of this Ordinance through the use of off-site compliance options, where applicable, then a letter of availability from the off-site provider must be included, per 9VAC25-870-55.B9 of the Code of Virginia. Approved off-site options must achieve the necessary nutrient reductions prior to the commencement of the applicant's land-disturbing activity except as otherwise allowed by § 62.1-44.15:35 of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) Elements of the stormwater management plans that include activities regulated under Chapter 4 (§54.1-400 et seq.) of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia shall be appropriately sealed and signed by a professional registered in the Commonwealth of Virginia pursuant to Article 1 (§ 54.1-400 et seq.) of Chapter 4 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia, per 9VAC25-870-55.C of the Code of Virginia.
- (d) A construction record drawing for permanent stormwater management facilities shall be submitted to the Administrator, per 9VAC25-870-55.D of the Code of Virginia. The construction record drawing shall be appropriately sealed and signed by a professional registered in the Commonwealth of Virginia, certifying that the stormwater management facilities have been constructed in accordance with the approved plan.



**Sec. 25.8-7. – POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN; CONTENTS OF PLANS.**

- (a) Pollution Prevention Plan, required by 9VAC25-870-56 of the Code of Virginia, shall be developed, implemented, and updated as necessary and must detail the design, installation, implementation, and maintenance of effective pollution prevention measures to minimize the discharge of pollutants. At a minimum, per 9VAC25-870-56.A 1-3, B 1-4 and 9VAC25-870-55 C of the Code of Virginia, such measures must be designed, installed, implemented, and maintained to:
  - (1) Minimize the discharge of pollutants from equipment and vehicle washing, wheel wash water, and other wash waters. Wash waters must be treated in a sediment basin or alternative control that provides equivalent or better treatment prior to discharge;
  - (2) Minimize the exposure of building materials, building products, construction wastes, trash, landscape materials, fertilizers, pesticides, herbicides, detergents, sanitary waste, and other materials present on the site to precipitation and to stormwater; and
  - (3) Minimize the discharge of pollutants from spills and leaks and implement chemical spill and leak prevention and response procedures.
- (b) The pollution prevention plan shall include effective best management practices to prohibit the following discharges:
  - (1) Wastewater from washout of concrete, unless managed by an appropriate control;
  - (2) Wastewater from washout and cleanout of stucco, paint, form release oils, curing compounds, and other construction materials;
  - (3) Fuels, oils, or other pollutants used in vehicle and equipment operation and maintenance; and
  - (4) Soaps or solvents used in vehicle and equipment washing.
- (c) Discharges from dewatering activities, including discharges from dewatering of trenches and excavations, are prohibited unless managed by appropriate controls.

**Sec. 25.8-8. - REVIEW OF STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN.**

- (a) Per 9VAC25-870-108.A of the Code of Virginia, the Administrator or any duly authorized agent of the Administrator, shall review stormwater management plans and shall approve or disapprove a stormwater management plan according to the following, per 9VAC25-870-108.B:
  - (1) The Administrator shall determine the completeness of a plan in accordance with Section 25.8-6 of this Ordinance, and shall notify the applicant, in writing, of such determination, within 15 calendar days of receipt. If the plan is deemed to be incomplete, the above written notification shall contain the reasons the plan is deemed incomplete.

- (2) The Administrator shall have an additional 60 calendar days from the date of the communication of completeness to review the plan, except that if a determination of completeness is not made and communicated within 15 calendar days of receipt, then the plan shall be deemed complete as of the date of submission and the Administrator shall have 60 calendar days from the date of submission to review the plan.
  - (3) The Administrator shall review any plan that has been previously disapproved, within 45 calendar days of the date of resubmission.
  - (4) During the review period, the plan shall be approved or disapproved and the decision communicated in writing to the person responsible for the land-disturbing activity or his designated agent. If the plan is not approved, the reasons for not approving the plan shall be provided in writing. Approval or denial shall be based on the plan's compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance.
  - (5) If a plan meeting all requirements of this Ordinance is submitted and no action is taken within the time provided above in 25.8-8(a)(2) for review, the plan shall be deemed approved.
- (b) Approved stormwater plans may be modified as follows, per 9VAC25-870-108.C of the Code of Virginia:
- (1) Modifications to an approved stormwater management plan shall be allowed only after review and written approval by the Administrator. The Administrator shall have 60 calendar days to respond in writing either approving or disapproving such request.
  - (2) The Administrator may require that an approved stormwater management plan be amended, within a time prescribed by the Administrator, to address any deficiencies noted during inspection.
- (c) The Administrator shall require the submission of a construction record drawing for permanent stormwater management facilities. The Administrator may elect not to require construction record drawings for stormwater management facilities for which recorded maintenance agreements are not required pursuant to 9VAC25-870-108.E.

**Sec. 25.8-9 - TECHNICAL CRITERIA FOR REGULATED LAND DISTURBING ACTIVITIES.**

To protect the quality and quantity of state water from the potential harm of unmanaged stormwater runoff resulting from land-disturbing activities, the City of Franklin hereby adopts the technical criteria for regulated land-disturbing activities set forth in Part II B of the Regulations, as amended, expressly to include 9VAC25-870-62 through 99 of the Regulations, which shall apply to all land-disturbing activities regulated pursuant to this Ordinance, except as expressly set forth in Subsection (b) of this Section.

- (a) Per 9VAC25-870-48 of the Code of Virginia, until June 30, 2019, any land-disturbing activity shall be considered grandfathered by the VSMP authority and shall be subject to the Part II C technical criteria of the VSMP Regulation provided
  - 1. A proffered or conditional zoning plan, zoning with a plan of development, preliminary or final subdivision plat, preliminary or final site plan, or any document determined by the locality to be equivalent thereto (i) was approved by the locality prior to July 1, 2012, (ii) provided a layout as defined in 9VAC25-870-10, (iii) will comply with Part II C technical criteria of the VSMP Regulation, and (iv) has not been subsequently modified or amended in a manner resulting in an increase in the amount of phosphorus leaving each point of discharge, and such that there is no increase in the volume or rate of runoff;
  - 2. A state permit has not been issued prior to July 1, 2014; and
  - 3. Land disturbance did not commence prior to July 1, 2014.
- (b) Locality, state and federal projects shall be considered grandfathered by the VSMP authority and shall be subject to the Part II C technical criteria of the VSMP Regulation provided:
  - 1. There has been an obligation of locality, state or federal funding, in whole or in part, prior to July 1, 2012, or the department has an approved stormwater management plan prior to July 1, 2012;
  - 2. A state permit has not been issued prior to July 1, 2014; and
  - 3. Land disturbance did not commence prior to July 1, 2014.
- (c) Land disturbing activities grandfathered under subsections A and B of this section shall remain subject to the Part II C technical criteria of the VSMP Regulation for one additional state permit cycle. After such time, portions of the project not under construction shall become subject to any new technical criteria adopted by the board.
- (d) In cases where government bonding or public debt financing has been issued for a project prior to July 1, 2012, such project shall be subject to the technical criteria of Part II C.
- (e) Noting in this section shall preclude an operator from constructing to a more stringent standard at his discretion.
- (f) Exceptions to the requirement that the land-disturbing activity obtain required VSMP authority permit shall not be given by the Administrator, nor shall the Administrator approve the use of a BMP not found on the Virginia Stormwater BMP Clearinghouse Website, or any other control measure duly approved by the Director.
  - (1) Exceptions to requirements for phosphorus reductions shall not be allowed unless offsite options otherwise permitted pursuant to 9VAC25-870-122 have been considered and found not available.

**Sec. 25.8-10 - LONG-TERM MAINTENANCE OF PERMANENT STORMWATER FACILITIES**

- (a) The Administrator shall require the provision of long-term responsibility for and maintenance of stormwater management facilities and other techniques specified to manage the quality and quantity of runoff, per 9VAC25-870-58 of the Code of Virginia. Such requirements shall be set forth in an instrument recorded in the local land records prior to general permit termination or earlier as required by the Administrator per 9VAC25-870-112.A and shall at a minimum:
  - (1) Be submitted to the Administrator for review and approval prior to the approval of the stormwater management plan;
  - (2) Be stated to run with the land;
  - (3) Provide for all necessary access to the property for purposes of maintenance and regulatory inspections;
  - (4) Provide for inspections and maintenance and the submission of inspection and maintenance reports to the Administrator; and
  - (5) Be enforceable by all appropriate governmental parties.
- (b) At the discretion of the Administrator, such recorded instruments need not be required for stormwater management facilities designed to treat stormwater runoff primarily from an individual residential lot on which they are located, provided it is demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Administrator that future maintenance of such facilities will be addressed through an enforceable mechanism at the discretion of the Administrator, per 9VAC25-870-112.B of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) Per 9VAC25-870-114.D of the Code of Virginia, if a recorded instrument is not required pursuant to 25.8-10 (b), the Administrator shall develop a strategy for addressing maintenance of stormwater management facilities designed to treat stormwater runoff primarily from an individual residential lot on which they are located. Such a strategy may include periodic inspections, homeowner outreach and education, or other method targeted at promoting the long-term maintenance of such facilities.

**Sec. 25.8-11. - MONITORING AND INSPECTIONS.**

- (a) The Administrator shall inspect the land-disturbing activity during construction for, per 9VAC25-870-114.A of the Code of Virginia:
  - (1) Compliance with the approved erosion and sediment control plan;
  - (2) Compliance with the approved stormwater management plan;
  - (3) Development, updating, and implementation of a pollution prevention plan; and
  - (4) Development and implementation of any additional control measures necessary to address a TMDL.

- (b) The Administrator may, at reasonable times and under reasonable circumstances, enter any establishment or upon any property, public or private, for the purpose of obtaining information or conducting surveys or investigations necessary in the enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance, per 62.1-44.15:39 of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) In accordance with a performance bond with surety, cash escrow, letter of credit, any combination thereof, or such other legal arrangement or instrument, the Administrator may also enter any establishment or upon any property, public or private, for the purpose of initiating or maintaining appropriate actions which are required by the permit conditions associated with a land-disturbing activity when a permittee, after proper notice, has failed to take acceptable action within the time specified.
- (d) Pursuant to § 62.1-44.15:40 of the Code of Virginia, the Administrator may require every VSMP authority permit applicant or permittee, or any such person subject to VSMP authority permit requirements under this Ordinance, to furnish when requested such application materials, plans, specifications, and other pertinent information as may be necessary to determine the effect of his discharge on the quality of state waters, or such other information as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Ordinance.
- (e) Per 9VAC25-870-114.B.2, post-construction inspections of stormwater management facilities required by the provisions of this Ordinance shall be conducted by the Administrator pursuant to the City of Franklin's adopted and State Board approved inspection program, and shall occur, at minimum, at least once every five (5) years except as may otherwise be provided for in Section 25.8-10.

#### **Sec. 25.8-12. -- HEARINGS**

- (a) Any permit applicant or permittee, or person subject to Ordinance requirements, aggrieved by any action of the Administrator taken without a formal hearing, or by inaction of the Administrator, may demand in writing a formal hearing by the City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board as appointed by the Franklin City Council, provided a petition requesting such hearing is filed with the Administrator within 30 days after notice of such action is given by the Administrator, per 62.1-44.15:44 and 9VAC25-870-118 of the Code of Virginia.
- (b) The hearings held under this Section shall be conducted by the City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board at a regular or special meeting of the City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board at any other time and place authorized by the City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board, per 62.1-44.15:45 and 62.1-44.26 of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) A verbatim record of the proceedings of such hearings shall be taken and filed with the City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board. Depositions may be taken and read as in actions at law.
- (d) The City of Franklin Stormwater Management Appeals Board shall have power to issue subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum, and at the request of any party shall issue such

subpoenas. The failure of a witness without legal excuse to appear or to testify or to produce documents shall be acted upon by the local governing body whose action may include the procurement of an order of enforcement from the circuit court. Witnesses who are subpoenaed shall receive the same fees and reimbursement for mileage as in civil actions.

#### **Sec. 25.8-13. - APPEALS.**

(a) Any person jointly or severally aggrieved by any decision of the Stormwater Management Appeals Board, or any taxpayer or any officer, department, board, or bureau of the city may present to the circuit court of Southampton County a petition specifying the grounds on which aggrieved within thirty (30) days after the filing of the decision in the office of the board, per 62.1-44.15:46 of the Code of Virginia.

(b) Upon presentation of such petition, the court shall allow a writ of certiorari to review the decision of the Stormwater Management Appeals Board and shall prescribe therein the time within which a return thereto must be made and served upon the relator's attorney, which shall not be less than ten (10) days and may be extended by the court. The allowance of the writ shall not stay proceedings upon the decision appealed from, but the court may, on application, on notice to the board and due cause shown, grant a restraining order.

(c) The Stormwater Management Appeals Board shall not be required to return the original papers acted upon by it, but it shall be sufficient to return certified or sworn copies thereof or such portions thereof as may be called for by such writ. The return shall concisely set forth such other facts as may be pertinent and material to show the grounds of the decision appealed from and shall be verified.

(d) If, upon the hearing, it shall appear to the court that testimony is necessary for the proper disposition of the matter, it may take evidence or appoint a commissioner to take such evidence as it may direct and report the same to the court with his findings of fact and conclusions of law, which shall constitute a part of the proceedings upon which the determination of the court shall be made. The court may reverse or affirm, wholly or partly, or may modify the decision brought up for review.

(e) Costs shall not be allowed against the board, unless it shall appear to the court that it acted in bad faith or with malice in making the decision appealed from. In the event the decision of the board is affirmed and the court finds that the appeal was frivolous, the court may order the person who requested the issuance of the writ of certiorari to pay the costs incurred in making a return of the record pursuant to the writ of certiorari.

#### **Sec. 25.8-14. - ENFORCEMENT**

(a) If the Administrator determines that there is a failure to comply with the VSMP authority permit conditions or determines there is an unauthorized discharge, notice shall be served upon the permittee or person responsible for carrying out the permit conditions by any of the following: verbal warnings and inspection reports, notices of corrective action, consent special orders, and notices to comply, per 62.1-44.15:37 A and 9VAC25-870-

116.A of the Code of Virginia. Written notices shall be served by registered or certified mail to the address specified in the permit application or by delivery at the site of the development activities to the agent or employee supervising such activities.

- (1) The notice shall specify the measures needed to comply with the permit conditions and shall specify the time within which such measures shall be completed, per 62.1-44.15:37A of the Code of Virginia. Upon failure to comply within the time specified, a stop work order may be issued in accordance with Subsection (b) or the permit may be revoked by the Administrator.
- (2) If a permittee fails to comply with a notice issued in accordance with this Section within the time specified, the Administrator may issue an order requiring the owner, permittee, person responsible for carrying out an approved plan, or the person conducting the land-disturbing activities without an approved plan or required permit to cease all land-disturbing activities until the violation of the permit has ceased, or an approved plan and required permits are obtained, and specified corrective measures have been completed, per 62.1-44.15:37 A of the Code of Virginia.

Such orders shall be issued in accordance with the Franklin - Southampton Community Development Policies and Procedures Manual for Stormwater Management. Such orders shall become effective upon service on the person by certified mail, return receipt requested, sent to his address specified in the land records of the locality, or by personal delivery by an agent of the Administrator. However, if the Administrator finds that any such violation is grossly affecting or presents an imminent and substantial danger of causing harmful erosion of lands or sediment deposition in waters within the watersheds of the Commonwealth or otherwise substantially impacting water quality, it may issue, without advance notice or hearing, an emergency order directing such person to cease immediately all land-disturbing activities on the site and shall provide an opportunity for a hearing, after reasonable notice as to the time and place thereof, to such person, to affirm, modify, amend, or cancel such emergency order. If a person who has been issued an order is not complying with the terms thereof, the Administrator may institute a proceeding for an injunction, mandamus, or other appropriate remedy in accordance with Subsection 28.8-14 (c).

- (b) In addition to any other remedy provided by this Ordinance, if the Administrator or his designee determines that there is a failure to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance, they may initiate such informal and/or formal administrative enforcement procedures in a manner that is consistent with the City of Franklin Municipal Code, per 62.1-44.15:49 and 9VAC25-870-116.A.1 of the Code of Virginia.
- (c) Any person violating or failing, neglecting, or refusing to obey any rule, regulation, ordinance, order, approved standard or specification, or any permit condition issued by the Administrator may be compelled in a proceeding instituted in Circuit Court of Southampton County to obey same and to comply therewith by injunction, mandamus or other appropriate remedy.

- (d) Per 62.1-44.15:49 and 9VAC25-870-116 of the Code of Virginia, any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance or who fails, neglects, or refuses to comply with any order of the Administrator, shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$32,500 for each violation within the discretion of the court. Each day of violation of each requirement shall constitute a separate offense.
- (1) Violations for which a penalty may be imposed under this Subsection shall include but not be limited to the following:
- (i) No state permit registration;
  - (ii) No SWPPP;
  - (iii) Incomplete SWPPP;
  - (iv) SWPPP not available for review;
  - (v) No approved erosion and sediment control plan;
  - (vi) Failure to install stormwater BMPs or erosion and sediment controls;
  - (vii) Stormwater BMPs or erosion and sediment controls improperly installed or maintained;
  - (viii) Operational deficiencies;
  - (ix) Failure to conduct required inspections;
  - (x) Incomplete, improper, or missed inspections; and
  - (xi) Discharges not in compliance with the requirements of Section 4VAC 50-60-1170 of the general permit.
- (2) The Administrator may issue a summons for collection of the civil penalty and the action may be prosecuted in the appropriate court.
- (3) In imposing a civil penalty pursuant to this Subsection, the court may consider the degree of harm caused by the violation and also the economic benefit to the violator from noncompliance.
- (4) Any civil penalties assessed by a court as a result of a summons issued by the Administrator shall be paid into the treasury of the City of Franklin to be used for the purpose of minimizing, preventing, managing, or mitigating pollution of the waters of the locality and abating environmental pollution therein in such manner as the court may, by order, direct.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other civil or equitable remedy provided by this Section or by law, any person who willfully or negligently violates any provision of this Ordinance, any order of the Administrator, any condition of a permit, or any order of a court shall, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by confinement in jail for not more than 12 months or a fine of not less than \$2,500 nor more than \$32,500, or both.

#### **Sec. 25.8-15. - FEES**

- (a) Fees to cover costs associated with implementation of a VSMP related to land disturbing activities and issuance of general permit coverage and VSMP authority permits shall be imposed in accordance with Table 1, per 62.1-44.15:28 of the Code of Virginia. When a site or sites has been purchased for development within a previously permitted common plan of development or sale, the Applicant shall be subject to fees ("total fee to be paid



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by applicant” column) in accordance with the disturbed acreage of their site or sites according to Table 1.

\* If the project is completely administered by the Department such as may be the case for a state or federal project or projects covered by individual permits, the entire applicant fee shall be paid to the Department.

- (b) Fees for the modification or transfer of registration statements from the general permit issued by the State Board shall be imposed in accordance with Table 2, per 9VAC25-870-825 of the Code of Virginia. If the general permit modifications result in changes to stormwater management plans that require additional review by the City of Franklin, such reviews shall be subject to the fees set out in Table 2. The fee assessed shall be based on the total disturbed acreage of the site. In addition to the general permit modification fee, modifications resulting in an increase in total disturbed acreage shall pay the difference in the initial permit fee paid and the permit fee that would have applied for the total disturbed acreage in Table 1.

General permit coverage maintenance fees shall be paid annually to the City of Franklin, by the anniversary date of general permit coverage. No permit will be reissued or automatically continued without payment of the required fee. General permit coverage maintenance fees shall be applied until a Notice of Termination is effective.

(d) The fees set forth in Subsections (a) through (c) above, shall apply to:

- (1) All persons seeking coverage under the general permit.
- (2) All permittees who request modifications to or transfers of their existing registration statement for coverage under a general permit.
- (3) Persons whose coverage under the general permit has been revoked shall apply to the Administrator for an Individual Permit for Discharges of Stormwater From Construction Activities.
- (4) Permit and permit coverage maintenance fees outlined under Section 25.8-15 (c) may apply to each general permit holder.

(e) No general permit application fees will be assessed to:

- (1) Permittees who request minor modifications to general permits as defined in Section 25.8-2 of this Ordinance. Permit modifications at the request of the permittee resulting in changes to stormwater management plans that require additional review by the Administrator shall not be exempt pursuant to this Section.
  - (2) Permittees whose general permits are modified or amended at the initiative of the VSMP authority, excluding errors in the registration statement identified by the Administrator or errors related to the acreage of the site.
- (f) All incomplete payments will be deemed as nonpayments, and the applicant shall be notified of any incomplete payments. Interest may be charged for late payments at the underpayment rate set forth in 9VAC25-870-770 of the Code of Virginia and is calculated on a monthly basis at the applicable periodic rate. A 10% late payment fee shall be charged to any delinquent (over 90 days past due) account. The City of Franklin shall be entitled to all remedies available under the Code of Virginia in collecting any past due amount.

**Sec. 25.8-16. Performance Bond (9VAC25-870-104.D and Code 62.1-44.15:34A)**

Prior to issuance of any permit, the Applicant shall be required to submit a reasonable performance bond with surety, cash escrow, letter of credit, any combination thereof, or such other legal arrangement acceptable to the City of Franklin Attorney, to ensure that measures could be taken by the City of Franklin at the Applicant's expense should he fail, after proper notice, within the time specified to initiate or maintain appropriate actions which may be required of him by the permit conditions as a result of his land disturbing activity. If the City of Franklin takes such action upon such failure by the Applicant, the City of Franklin may collect from the Applicant for the difference should the amount of the reasonable cost of such action exceed the amount of the security held, if any. Within 60 days of the completion of the requirements of the permit conditions, such bond, cash escrow, letter of credit or other legal arrangement, or the unexpended or unobligated portion thereof, shall be refunded to the Applicant or terminated.

Enclosed is a revised non-binding consent resolution for the Western Tidewater Regional Jail Authority debt refinancing. As explained in the attached email from bond counsel, Arthur Anderson, with McGuire & Woods, the previous resolution must be replaced with a corrected version. Minor clerical type changes in recital B and Paragraphs 1 and 3 are necessary to properly identify the bonds, clarify the purpose and replace the previously approved resolution with the corrected version. Based upon my inquiry after the April 14<sup>th</sup> Council meeting concerning the purpose of the language in paragraph 4 regarding publishing, the language was deleted as it was not necessary. The Bond Counsel indicated it was a carryover from a previous City resolution in 2011 as explained in his email.

Also enclosed is a marked version of the corrections and a clean corrected version on letterhead. It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution 2014 – 06 to complete the City's role in this matter.

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

A. The Western Tidewater Regional Jail Authority (the “Authority”) was created pursuant to Article 3.1, Chapter 3, Title 53.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, by the City of Franklin, Virginia, the County of Isle of Wight, Virginia, and the City of Suffolk, Virginia (collectively, the “Member Jurisdictions”).

B. As authorized by a resolution adopted by the board of directors of the Authority on April 9, 2014, the Authority proposes to issue its revenue refunding bonds in an aggregate principal amount of up to \$5,200,000 (the “2014 Bonds”) for the purpose of (a) refunding the Authority’s \$2,638,000 Revenue and Refunding Bond, Series 2011A and its \$3,773,000 Revenue and Refunding Bond, Series 2011B (collectively, the “Refunded Bonds”) issued on May 10, 2011 to (i) finance or refinancing the acquisition, construction and equipping of certain capital improvements to the Authority’s regional jail facility, (ii) refund the Authority’s Revenue and Refunding Bond, Series 2008 and (iii) finance the costs of issuing the Refunded Bonds; and (b) paying the costs of issuing the 2014 Bonds.

C. The goal of the Authority in refunding the Refunded Bonds is to secure debt service savings for the Authority and the Member Jurisdictions.

D. The financing of the 2014 Bonds requires a “moral obligation” pledge by each of the Member Jurisdictions to pay its pro rata share of any debt service on the 2014 Bonds for which the Authority’s net revenues are insufficient.

E. Section 4.1 (b) of the Amended and Restated Service Agreement dated as of April 15, 2011 (the “Service Agreement”), by and among the Authority and its Member Jurisdictions sets forth provisions for actuating the moral obligation pledge.

F. Section 5.9 of the Service Agreement requires the consent of each of the Member Jurisdictions to the issuance by the Authority of the 2014 Bonds.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia (the “City”), that:

1. The City hereby consents to the Authority’s issuance of the 2014 Bonds for the purposes described in Recitals B and C above, subject to the adoption of similar resolutions by the governing bodies of the other Member Jurisdictions.

2. The City hereby pledges and agrees that if during any fiscal year the Authority lacks sufficient funds to pay scheduled debt service on the 2014 Bonds or any other bonds issued in

accordance with the Service Agreement, or to fulfill any debt service reserve funding requirements, the City will pay, subject to the conditions contained in Section 4.1 (b) of the Service Agreement and the limitations set forth below, a portion of such insufficiency equal to its pro rata share as determined pursuant to Section 3.2 of the Service Agreement. Any such payment will be subject to the appropriation of funds by the City Council of the City and shall constitute a moral, non-binding payment obligation. In no event shall the obligation of the City under Section 4.1 (b) of the Service Agreement be deemed to constitute a debt within the meaning of the Constitution of Virginia.

3. This resolution amends, restates and supercedes the resolution entitled "**Resolution of the City Council of the City of Franklin, Virginia, Approving the Issuance of Revenue Refunding Bonds by the Western Tidewater Regional Jail Authority,**" which the City Council of the City adopted on April 14, 2014.

**Kyle relayed your request that I provide a short explanation for the changes to the resolution evidencing Franklin's consent to the proposed WTRJA refunding. I have attached the lined version of the revised resolution for ease of reference.**

**The change to Recital B is to correct the title of the bond that was refunded by the 2011 Bonds. We had the right series (Series 2008), but the wrong name.**

**The change to paragraph 1 is to clarify that the 2014 bond proceeds will be used to refund the 2011 bonds and the purpose for the refunding is to obtain debt service savings.**

**The new paragraph 3 states that the resolution supersedes the one adopted on April 14.**

**The language deleted from paragraph 4 is of uncertain origin—it was in the 2011 Franklin consent resolution—but probably is an incomplete reference to the fact that Virginia law does not require a published notice or the holding of a public hearing as conditions to City Council's approval of the consent resolution. At any rate, the language is not necessary.**
