Call to Order

Mayor Frank Rabil called the November 16, 2020 City Council Retreat to order at 5:45 p.m.

Welcome and Overview

Amanda Jarratt, City Manager gave a brief overview on the items that she hoped to review with City Council over the course of the retreat.

She stated by the summer of 2021 City Council would start their borrowing for the Southampton County Courthouse project.

Capital Projects

Tower and Radio System

Amanda Jarratt, City Manager gave a brief introduction concerning the City's tower and radio system. She explained to Council since February of 2018 the Hunterdale water tower has been scheduled to be painted and rehabilitated. At that time the contractor sent the City of Franklin a formal request for the removal of all antenna equipment from the tank prior to the commencement of any work by their crews and listed four points of concern they had regarding the equipment. The costs of the removal of the equipment had not been budgeted.

The equipment located on the antennae ring, at the top of the Hunterdale tank consists of the following: HR TACRAN microwave, ORION microwave, Franklin Police Department radio antenna, and two amateur radio antennae's.

The equipment will need to be relocated for a period of four to six months during the rehabilitation process. The HR TACRAN system is the City's means of communication during times of disaster and during our EOC activation. It is the link to the Virginia Department of Emergency Management. The ORION system is the link within the Hampton Roads region which allows communication with other localities that may respond to assist our jurisdiction or us with their jurisdiction. It is also used multiple times per week to coordinate operations with a variety of taskforces that we participate in. The amateur radio antennae ware utilized during times of emergency as outlined in the City's Disaster Response Plan.

The City of Franklin radio system is also in desperate need of upgrading. The placement of the tower tics into the radio system that we pursue. Southampton County is also in the process of upgrading their radio system. Chief Patterson and Chief Francis will be on hand to discuss the tower options and next steps.

The radio service for the police officers and the firefighters is terrible, they cannot communicate very well which could possible create a liability issue for the City.

Community Electric needed a tower in the City of Franklin and Hunterdale area therefore they had reached out to the City and offered to split the tower expense 50/50, but now they do not need it so that offer is no longer available.

City Manager Jarratt introduced Chief Patterson to review further options with Council.

Chief Patterson explained that the City could take \$450,000.00 and try to install the mounts on the water tower. Another option is the City of Suffolk, Isle of Wight County and York-Poquoson communications centers have basically merged resources which is a message switch is located in Suffolk and a message switch located in York-Poquoson communicate with each other which allows Isle of Wight to join. Chief Patterson explained that the above option comes with a hefty price of 1.5 to 1.9 million. Another option is the City can go with Atlantic Communications and get the City's system brought up-to-date which is all City departments would receive new radios. The price of the above option is \$480,000.00. There has been some discussion between Southampton County and the City of Franklin. He then introduced Chief Francis, to explain that option.

City Manager Jarratt interjected and stated that she did not want someone to come into the City of Franklin ten years from now and ask why the City chose that option. She asked City Council not to just think about the options that were given, but to fix the problem and not just put a Band-Aid on the problem.

Chief Francis explained that Southampton County also needs to issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a new radio system. He added he thinks that the City as well as the County need a tower in order to improve communications the way it needs to be improved. He suggested partnering with Southampton County. It may cost the City more than \$450,000.00 but at least we would have better communications and a long term fix to the problem.

City Manager Jarratt added the perfect location for a tower is what is known as the Franklin Summit located on Armory Drive. She then opened the floor for questions.

Councilman Ray Smith asked Chief Francis, Chief Patterson and City Manager Jarratt what system did they want.

Chief Francis replied he would like to pick up a radio and know that there is good coverage available. He stated he would like to see Southampton County and the City of Franklin partner in order to improve communications.

Councilman Smith asked if the police or fire department can communicate with the State Police.

Chief Patterson replied only if they switch channels.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins asked what was the projected cost to be on our own communications system.

City Manager Jarratt answered with the Motorola system the price was projected at \$1.5 million and with the Atlantic system the price was projected at \$484,000.00 plus a place to hang the system which will be on the water tower.

Chief Patterson added the Motorola system is the choice in the Hampton Roads area.

Councilman Linwood Johnson asked if the City would be able to communicate with other localities when the radio system is upgraded.

Chief Francis replied that would depend on which system the City chose.

Mayor Frank Rabil asked if the City could move forward with the RFP with no strings attached.

Chief Francis answered that Southampton County was going to present to their Board of Supervisors sometime in the month of November.

City Manager Jarratt stated the decision is up to City Council on which direction they want to go.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins suggested the City do their own tower and then check into leasing space on the tower to help recoup some of the funds spent on the tower.

Councilman Smith requested City Staff bring the proposal of doing their own tower in a budget format for approval.

Internet Redundancy (LTE Failover Internet Backup Solution)

City Manager Amanda Jarratt gave City Council a brief overview of the internet redundancy issue. The internet is more than a mere convenience today; it is a necessity. The City relies on the internet to provide our offices with communications, email, phones, video conferencing apps, and now online services. Currently, the City uses a single source fiber. This fiber connection begins at the Police Department and then passes to Public Works, where it is redistributed throughout the remainder of the City's offices through a, City owned, fiber network. As we have experienced recently, this single point service is vulnerable should any one part of this distribution system fail. Having a backup network available in each City building would allow the City to have a diverse redundant source of connectivity should one of these points of distribution fail.

Pepwave provides a network device that is capable of using several LTE cellular radios to provide a backup solution for each City building. The Peplink Balance SDX uses three LTE connections for the necessary bandwidth required to meet the internet needs of each building. The SDX is capable of Drop-In mode which will allow the router to be installed in a network with zero configuration. Should the fiber connection fail, the SDX router would automatically fall over to the backup LTE connection. Once the fiber connection is reestablished, the LTE connection would switch back over almost instantaneously to the fiber. The three LTE connections would be necessary to provide enough bandwidth for the City's offices to conduct their respective business. LTE failover using the SDX will provide a diverse connection that is not tied to our current fiber network. The SDX would allow the City to continue to function should the City's fiber be interrupted for whatever reason. Based on the usage at the Police Department, three LTE connections at each site should give each office ample enough bandwidth to meet their online needs.

City Manager Jarratt added in today's times the City cannot afford to lose its internet service.

The estimated cost to the City is \$33,000.00. It is essential that this be included in the FY21-22 budget.

The consensus of City Council was to move forward with putting this proposal in the FY21-22 budget.

Acquisition of Property

City Manager Jarratt gave an overview for the property acquisition for The Franklin Redevelopment and Housing office building. The Franklin Redevelopment and Housing Authority (FRHA) has indicated that they intend to sell their home office located at 100 Fourth Avenue. The property is assessed at \$433,300.00. The FRHA has indicated that they would like to offer the City of Franklin the first opportunity to purchase the property prior to listing it with a realtor. As some of you are well aware there have been constant issues with the Social Services building. The building has had numerous mold issues related to the basement. The latest estimate to fill the basement of the Social Services building exceeded \$600,000.00.

City Manager Jarratt invited Council members to go by the Social Services Department and take a look at the basement so that they could see how bad the conditions were themselves. The City acquired the Social Services Building after the 1999 flood. There is algae growing on the floor and there is a constant stream of water flowing with electrical equipment hanging from the ceiling.

The FRHA has decided to sale the Franklin Redevelopment and Housing office building and reached out to the City to see if they were interested in purchasing the building before they put it on the market. Drew Page, Chairman of the Franklin Redevelopment and Housing Authority is to report to City Manager Jarratt how much is owed on the building but she thinks it is around \$270,000.00. City Manager Jarratt requested direction from Council on how to proceed with this project.

Councilman Ray Smith asked what would be done with the Social Services Building if Council decided to buy the Franklin Redevelopment and Housing office building.

City Manager Jarratt replied tear it down.

City Manager Jarratt informed City Council that the appraisal for the bathrooms located at Barrett's Landing is underway and should be in hand with the next two weeks.

Councilman Gregory McLemore stated that Council had agreed to repair the basement a long time ago.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins stated Council did, but those repairs were like putting a Band-Aid on the problem.

Councilman Mark R. Kitchen asked if the Social Services Building could be condemned.

Russ Pace, Director of Public Works replied that would be a question for the Building Official.

Councilman Ray Smith asked what was the best guess estimate for purchasing the Franklin Redevelopment and Housing office building and demolishing the Social Services Building.

City Manager Jarratt answered she thought the City could purchase the FRHA office building for \$250,000.00 and did not have an estimate on demolishing the Social Services building.

The Consensus of City Council was to proceed with trying to purchase the Franklin Redevelopment and Housing office building.

Personnel

SAFER Grant

City Manager Amanda Jarratt gave a brief overview of the SAFER Grant. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Grant Program s Directorate is responsible for the implementation and administration of the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) Grants SAFER grants provide financial assistance to help fire departments increase their cadre of frontline firefighters or to rehire firefighters that have been laid off, and to recruit and/or retain volunteer firefighters. City Manager Jarratt called Chief Francis to give further details concerning the SAFER Grant.

Chief Francis informed City Council that in 2012 the City of Franklin got approval to hire nine firefighters through the SAFER Grant. Chief Francis requested to hire twelve firefighters in order to qualify for the SAFER Grant. He estimated that it will cost a little over \$1,000,000,000.00 to do this. He added he does not expect the City to do this in one year, but requested City Council to come up a plan to accomplish this. It has been almost ten years since the City of Franklin Emergency Services has increased their staff.

City Manager Jarratt stated unfortunately in the last two years the City has frozen new hires in the Fire Department and Police Department due to budgetary needs, but the City is going to quickly find out that is not an option for the firefighter's safety. This is something that the City needs to plan for in the future.

Chief Francis stated the City has to have the allocated funds in order to qualify for the grant.

Health Insurance Contributions

City Manager Amanda Jarratt informed City Council that the cost of an employee's health insurance is the reason why the City of Franklin loses a lot of their staff as well as being able to recruit new hires in all Departments, (an employee has to pay \$1100.00 per month on the family plan). She added in the FY2022 budget she will most likely ask that Council to pass along savings if any, from the Health Insurance Plan on to the employee.

Salary Scale

City Manager Amanda Jarratt informed City Council that a regular firefighter is making 16% less in the City of Franklin than other localities. The City of Franklin will continue to lose employees this problem is not corrected. There are a lot of inequities within the City departments as far as salaries are concerned. The City is in need of a salary study in order to correct these problems.

City Council Matters

Ethics Code

City Manager Amanda Jarratt reminded City Council that they would have to discuss City Council matters such as ethics code and drug testing amongst themselves because she was considered an employee, she could not advise them on these matters. The City of Franklin personnel policy does not apply to City Council.

Councilman Ray Smith expressed that he thought that it was a waste of time to pursue an ethics code at this time.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins stated that everything he does is in the best interest of the City of Franklin.

Drug Testing

The consensus of City Council was to not take part in drug testing.

General Discussion Topics

Utility Bill Separation

City Manager Amanda Jarratt stated that several Council members asked that this item be put on the agenda. The City of Franklin is the only municipality in Hampton Roads that owns and operates an electric utility. In an attempt to clarify for the public that the bill is in fact for four various charges the charges were broken out in a box in the top right corner. The number of complaints has lessened over the last few months however, this is still seen as a public relations issue for the City. The majority of customers in the City receive all utility services. Therefore, all services are billed on one bill. If the electric is billed separately, an additional 6,000 accounts will have to be created, billed, monthly postage paid, BMS billing fee, Treasurer collected and posted separately, penalties / interest calculated separately, applications, etc. The costs associated with separating the utility bills will be additional staff in the Utility & Treasurer's Department as well as postage and BMS billing fees. If an electric customer is disconnected, all utilities have to be paid in full before services are reconnected. If electric is separated, the customer will direct how their payments will be applied. There will be exposure to the City's Water & Sewer fund accounts receivable. This has been discussed on numerous occasions but no formal direction has been given. The cost of separating the utility bills will be \$200,000.00.

Councilman Gregory McLemore suggested to discuss other options to simplify utility billing.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins requested to look into what other localities are doing.

City Manager Jarratt stated she would put the topic of utility billing on a future agenda for discussion.

Naming of City Facilities

City Manager Amanda Jarratt informed City Council that there have been several requests to name City facilities after individuals some deceased and some living. She asked City Council if they wanted to draft a set of policies concerning this topic.

The consensus of City Council was to revisit this topic in the future.

Grass Cutting and Landscaping

City Manager Amanda Jarratt informed City Council prior to 2009 the City of Franklin had full time and seasonal labor that cut all City properties, rights of way and cemeteries. After the closure of International Paper, the decision was made to outsource the operation to private contractors. The outsourcing has created frustrations at the staff level and the City has less control over our own operations and properties. Staff would suggest that we move to handling grass cutting in house. To do so and prepare to take this over on July 1. 2021, the City will need to purchase equipment and fill the positions. If Council concurs staff will need to authorize the funding at an upcoming Council meeting.

City Manager Jarratt stated she would bring this topic to City Council at the January 2021 City Council meeting so that the funds could be authorized in order to start purchasing equipment that will be required.

Dilapidated Properties

City Manager Amanda Jarratt stated this topic has been brought up at previous retreats. In order to properly handle the issue, the budget for demolition needs to be increased and the tools already available to staff need to be implemented. She added that she has asked the City's legal representation, Sands Anderson to look into the feasibility of a vacancy tax. The response was a vacancy tax was not allowed but the City can implement a derelict ablated property tax ordinance and this can be done if the community's fiscal distress score is greater than 107. The latest distress score that was found for the City of Franklin was 107.14, which was the 2018 score. The budget for Community Development will have to be increased in order for this project to take place.

Volunteers

City Manager Amanda Jarratt stated that City Council brought the subject of how to recruit volunteers for Boards and Commissions at their last City Council meeting.

Mayor Frank Rabil suggested each City Council member come up with some names of citizens that might be interested in volunteering for some of the City boards.

Councilman Gregory McLemore suggested having City Council interns to possibly inspire citizens to commit to serving on some of the City Boards and Commissions.

Other Topics of Discussion

City Manager Amanda Jarratt asked City Council if there were any more topics to discuss.

Councilman Ray Smith requested that staff look into parking in nondesignated areas such as yards and unlicensed vehicles throughout the City. He added that City Council move forward with the Golf Cart Ordinance.

Councilwoman Wynndolyn Copeland requested a paving study.

City Manager Jarratt asked if City Council desired to keep the scheduled joint meeting with the Southampton County Board of Supervisors about the Courthouse project.

The consensus of City Council was not to keep the scheduled joint meeting with the Southampton County Board of Supervisors.

City Manager Jarratt suggested the City Council needed to meet about the flooding in the Edgehill area and at Southampton Memorial Hospital.

Economic Development

City Manager Amanda Jarratt reminded City Council that Director of Franklin / Southampton Economic Development (FSEDI), Jay Brenchick's last day of employment was going to be on Monday, November 30, 2020. She asked Council for direction because FSEDI will start recruiting for a new director.

Councilman Ray Smith stated that FSEDI has not be very productive in the last year.

Councilman Gregory McLemore asked how much does the City of Franklin pay FSEDI.

City Manager Jarratt replied the City pays a \$100,000.00, Southampton County pays a \$100,000.00, Camp Foundation pays \$75,000.00 and the Charities pays \$125,000.00.

City Manager Jarratt stated if the City plans on keeping FSEDI in its current structure than some demands need to be made.

Councilman McLemore expressed that he thought that the City does not need to be involved with FSEDI.

Mayor Frank Rabil stated that the FSEDI Board needs to be reorganized.

Councilman Bobby Cutchins stated FSEDI is more beneficial for Southampton County than the City and is concerned about the accountability of seeing things follow through for the City was his concern. He added he did not know if that was because of the Board or the Directors.

Mayor Frank Rabil stated City Council needs to start telling FSEDI what to do instead of FSEDI tellin Council what they are going to do.



I am pleased to inform you that based on and in reliance upon the information and materials provided by Franklin City, the Center for Tech and Civic Life ("CTCL"), a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") section 501(c)(3), has decided to award a grant to support the work of Franklin City ("Grantee").

The following is a description of the grant:

AMOUNT OF GRANT: \$7,837.50 USD

PURPOSE: The grant funds must be used exclusively for the public purpose of planning and operationalizing safe and secure election administration in Franklin City in 2020 ("Purpose").

Before CTCL transmits these funds to Grantee, CTCL requires that Grantee review and sign this agreement ("Grant Agreement") and agree to use the grant funds in compliance with the Grant Agreement and with United States tax laws and the laws and regulations of your state and jurisdiction ("Applicable Laws"). Specifically, by signing this letter Grantee certifies and agrees to the following:

- 1. Grantee is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1).
- 2. This grant shall be used only for the Purpose described above, and for no other purposes.

- 3. Grantee has indicated that the amount of the grant shall be expended on the following specific election administration needs: Ballot drop boxes, Non-partisan voter education, Personal protective equipment (PPE) for staff, poll workers, or voters, Poll worker recruitment funds, hazard pay, and/or training expenses, Temporary staffing, Vote-by-mail/Absentee voting equipment or supplies, and Election administration equipment. Grantee may allocate grant funds among those needs, or to other public purposes listed in the grant application, without further notice to or permission of CTCL.
- 4. Grantee shall not use any part of this grant to make a grant to another organization, except in the case where the organization is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1) or a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under IRC section 501(c)(3), and the subgrant is intended to accomplish the Purpose of this grant. Grantee shall take reasonable steps to ensure that any such subgrant is used in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement, including requiring that subgrantee agrees in writing to comply with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 5. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs may be applied to the grant. The Grantee shall expend the amount of this grant for the Purpose by December 31, 2020.
- 6. Grantee is authorized to receive this grant from CTCL and certifies that (a) the receipt of these grant funds does not violate any Applicable Laws, and (b) Grantee has taken all required, reasonable and necessary steps to receive, accept and expend the grant in accordance with the Purpose and Applicable Law.
- 7. The Grantee shall produce a brief report explaining and documenting how grant funds have been expended in support of the activities described in paragraph 3. This report shall be sent to CTCL no later than January 31, 2021 in a format approved by CTCL and shall include with the report a signed certification by Grantee that it has complied with all terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 8. This grant may not supplant previously appropriated funds. The Grantee shall not reduce the budget of the General Registrar ("the Election Department") or fail to appropriate or provide previously budgeted funds to the Election Department for the term of this grant. Any amount supplanted, reduced or not provided in contravention of this paragraph shall be repaid to CTCL up to the total amount of this grant.
- 9. CTCL may discontinue, modify, withhold part of, or ask for the return all or part of the grant funds if it determines, in its sole judgment, that (a) any of the above terms and conditions of this grant have not been met, or (b) CTCL is required to do so to comply with applicable laws or regulations.
- 10. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs for the Purpose may be applied to the grant.



RE: Utility Mortarium & Repayment Plans

On November 18, 2020, Governor Northam signed the revised Virginia budget that included utility shutoff protection as well as provisions for repayment plans for utility customers.

The repayment plans allow customer's utility debt to be amortized over at least 6 months and up to 24 months. The plan cannot require any new deposits, down payments, fees, late fees, interest charges, or penalties and the plan cannot accrue any fees, interest, or penalties, including prepayment penalties. The customer has to attest that they have experienced a financial hardship resulting directly or indirectly from the public health emergency or that they have experienced a hardship to pay during the public health emergency.

The financial issue to address is the cash effect this may have on the Electric Fund. The VMEA monthly payment is approximately \$800,000 - \$1,000,000 per month. When the City stopped electric cutoffs during Governor's Executive Order 61, the City's electric 30-60 day category in the aged accounts receivable report increased \$150,000 per month. Assuming no customer takes advantage of the repayment plan, the Electric Fund will experience a cash deficit of \$1,050,000 as a result of the repayment plan implementation.

There is a provision in the revised Virginia budget plan that if a utility has accounts receivable arrearages that exceed 1% of the utility's annual operating revenues, the utility may obtain relief from the shutoff moratorium. I have reached out to Department of Housing & Community Development for clarification of what accounts receivable should be included in the 1% calculation.

If additional information is needed, please advise.

City Treasurer's 2020 Annual Report

Delinquent Taxes as of November 30, 2020

The delinquent tax amount for the City of Franklin as of November 30, 2020 is \$428,376.58. This amount reflects tax years 2018 and older for all taxes owed to the city. The last collection report dated November 30, 2019 was reported with delinquencies of \$635,329.14. This is a reduction of \$206,952.56 along with adding a full tax year.

Real Estate:

As of November 30, 2020 there is \$168,931.69 in delinquent Real Estate taxes for years 2003-2018. The cumulative collection rate for these years is 99.80%. The office continues to work with citizens who have become delinquent with payment plans. We currently have 20 taxpayers on monthly payment plans. The office will research the taxpayers through VEC (Virginia Employment Commission) for employment information and attach a lien against their place of employment based on the Code of Virginia 58.1-3919. The office currently have about 10 wage liens.

The Treasurer's office continues to work with Jason A. Dunn, PLC (Tax Attorney) out of VA. Beach to assist in selling properties who meet the requirements for a tax sale based on the Code of Virginia 58.1-3965.1. There are currently 30 properties being worked by Mr. Dunn's firm. Prior to sending the file to the firm the office has exhausted all possible efforts with the citizen.

Real Estate Cont....

Prior to properties being sold at a tax sale, Mr. Dunn's firm will enter into a payment plan with citizens. Once they enter into a plan, the citizen must stay current on the plan and pay all current taxes to the city.

We were unable to have a Tax Sale in 2020 due to COVID-19. We have 5 properties ready for sale once we feel having a sale will be safe for all involved, hopefully in 2021.

For RE2019 tax year, of the 5.5 million budgeted, we have \$138,219.76 uncollected, showing a 97% collection rate as of November 30, 2020. Any payments paid on delinquent real estate is applied to the oldest tax first.

Personal Property:

As of November 30, 2020 there is \$259,244.64 in delinquent personal property taxes for tax year 2008-2018. The cumulative collection rate for these years is 98.71%. Due to last years conversion we were unable to apply a DMV-STOP on the 2018 delinquent accounts and due to COVID-19, I made the decision not to apply Stops on the delinquent accounts since the DMV offices were closed to the public. Once the DMV offices opened back up we applied stops on the 2018 accounts first. We continue to work with taxpayers on monthly payment plans. Plans are usually made so that their taxes are satisfied prior to the next years assessment and due date. Any and all prior delinquent taxes must be satisfied prior to being able to make a new payment plan. Due to the pandemic we choose not to do any vehicle seizures for delinquent taxes. This is the primary reason for the increase in the personal property delinquencies.

Personal Property Cont.....

For PP2019 tax year, of the 2.8 million budgeted, we have \$163,904.09 uncollected, showing a 94% collection rate as of November 30, 2020. Due to COVID-19 and the DMV offices closed to the public and the extensions given for registrations we choose to delay putting DMV-Stops on PP2019 accounts. These Stops will be applied January 2021.

Due to the Statute of Limitations as per Code of Virginia 58.1-3040, I will be requesting City Council to approve charging off Personal Property 2013 in the amount of \$24,801.31. Based on years of collection attempts, I deem these accounts uncollectable.

Meals and Lodging

Currently there are no delinquent Meals Taxes that have filed with the Commissioner of the Revenue's office.

Currently there are no delinquent Lodging Taxes that have filed with the Commissioner of the Revenue's office.




Business License

- ► Cumulative Percentage for Personal Property for 2008-2018 is 98.71%
- The Treasurer's office was awarded the Office of Accreditation for the Seventh year in a row by the Treasurer's Association of Virginia. This is the highest award given by the Association. One of the requirements to receive this award the office must have a collection rate of 95% or higher for Real Estate and 90% or higher for Personal Property.
- I received my recertification as a Master Governmental Treasurer through the University of Virginia; Weldon Cooper Center for Public Service. This certification is required to be recertified every four years. Yearly requirements have to be met to maintain the certification.
- Due to COVID-19 the Treasurer's Association was unable to have the Annual Conference where I was to be sworn in as President. Since there are still some uncertainty as to whether a conference will be able to be hosted in 2021, I have been asked to host the 2022 Conference where I will be sworn in as president at that time.

Treasurer's Office News

- ▶ Selenia Boone was awarded the Star Performer Award for a job well done working the unclaimed property with the Department of Treasury. With her continued efforts she was able to collect \$62,784.40 which was applied to delinquent taxes and inactive utilities. Last year we had a total of 138 claims for a total of \$1,604.43.
- ► The Treasurer's Office has contributed 336 nonperishable items to Franklin Cooperative Ministry this year. Our goal was to contribute 260 in which we exceeded. We challenged ourselves to do this even before the pandemic hit our area. Our goal is to continue this support for 2021.

Background

As you are aware the City is in the process of updating our Personnel Policy. An updated Travel Policy is attached for your review and consideration

Needed Action

Adopt the Travel Policy as presented.

603 TRAVEL AND MEALS POLICY

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this travel policy is to provide the City Council, employees and citizens with a clear reference on the procedures for reporting and recording travel expenses as required by and within the course of official duty for the City of Franklin. It is the purpose of this regulation to provide a reasonable, systematic means by which the costs of such travel and expenses may be estimated for budget preparation purposes and controlled for purposes of economy. These regulations are intended to be consistent with efficient operation, while providing guidance for the traveler and maintaining accountability of the City's resources.

For purposes of this policy, out-of-town travel is defined as all travel outside the City's limit in excess of 120 miles roundtrip from the employee's normal worksite.

The official form to complete for authorized travel is the Report of Travel Expenses and can be found on the City's intranet site (https:cof-fire1/cof/default.aspx)

II. DEFINITIONS:

- A. Accounts Payable the Department of Finance, Accounting Division, Accounts Payable Team.
- B. Constitutional Officers with the authority to permit travel on City business.
- C. Daily Per Diem Allowance Provides a daily allowance for meal reimbursement without receipts for overnight official business travel.
- D. Employee/Traveler The individual employed by the City and representing the City on an authorized business trip.
- E. Miscellaneous Reimbursement Amount A flat reimbursement amount that may be used to recover expenses in lieu of receipts and may not exceed five dollars per day for each day of a trip requiring lodging. Miscellaneous reimbursement amounts may include bellhop, waiter, taxi, limousine tips, personal telephone calls, laundry, and transportation between lodging or business and places where meal may be taken.

F. Daily Business – Travel Record & Mileage Report – Form used to document legitimate business expenses and to claim reimbursement. An interactive form is available on the City's intranet site within the Finance Department section (https:cof-fire1/cof/default.aspx).

III. PROCEDURE:

- A. Official procedures and forms to accomplish this administrative policy have been developed and are maintained by the Department of Finance. By reference, the official procedures and forms are considered part of this policy.
- B. The amount needed for annual travel and related expenses should be included in the annual budget request of the various City departments.

IV. RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY:

- A. All Department Heads and Constitutional Officers are responsible for determining if there is sufficient funding for anticipated travel expenses prior to travel, ensuring compliance with this policy, and reviewing, authorizing and approving travel-related settlements and reimbursement requests. Department Heads and Constitutional Officers may establish lower per diem limits for their operations to conserve travel dollars.
- B. Department Heads and Constitutional Officers have the sole authority to grant or deny requests for business travel and travel reimbursements.
- C. Business travel authorizations and reimbursement for Department Heads and members of the City Manager's staff shall be made directly by the City Manager or designee. Employees under the direction of Department Heads and Constitutional Officers shall receive authorization and reimbursement approval from such officials.
- D. Business travel outside the continental United States is subject to approval of City Council. Written notice is to be given to the City Council by the City Manager or designee at least two weeks prior to the intended departure which shall list the purpose of the travel, the destination, members of the traveling group, duration of stay, costs and point of contact. Only where such prior notice is not possible because of unforeseen circumstances and for good cause, immediate written notice shall be provided to the City Council. For international travelers, the department head should require their awareness of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act.
- E. The traveler shall submit an authorized request for out-of-town travel at a minimum of two weeks before departure. It is the responsibility of the traveler to submit a single Report of Travel/Training Expenses per trip with original authorized itemized receipts for charges no later than ten working days after conclusion of the trip. Items covered by the per diem do not require receipts.

- F. The traveler shall be responsible to the City for any fees, deposits and other travel expenses in the event the submitted expenses are not in compliance with these regulations. Where all or a portion of any such fees, deposits and expenses have been prepaid on behalf of the traveler, and the traveler is unable to attend, timely notification shall be given. If, through no fault of the traveler, it becomes impossible to attend the scheduled event because of illness, emergency, or other cause beyond the control of the traveler, or unforeseen business requirements associated with the traveler's position with the City, the traveler shall be excused from the repayment of any such fees, deposits and expenses.
- G. Failure to meet the requirements of this policy may be considered unsatisfactory work performance and may result in disciplinary action.
- H. Other administrative policies, including the prompt reporting of injuries, accidents, etc. are in force during travel.
- I. Travel expenses are public documents and must be able to sustain the test of public review. Prudent judgment is expected when planning and paying for travel. Standards of necessity must be met. The use of City Funds to accommodate personal comfort, convenience and taste is not permitted.

V. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Travel expenses may include necessary expenses associated with official City business. Allowable expenses may include travel, transportation, lodging, per diem meal allowance and other business expenses if not paid by any other organization. Original itemized receipts will be required except as expressly provided for within this policy.
- B. Employees may travel and have expenses provided as an officer, board member or presenter for professional organizations. Whenever possible, an effort to have the requesting organization reimburse a portion or all of the expenses involved is strongly encouraged. Employees may not request duplicate reimbursement from different funding sources.
- C. Approval for travel is not a blanket approval of all expenses incurred during travel. For example, the City will not pay the expenses of accompanying spouses or others, personal items, childcare, pet boarding, or other indirect expenses except as specifically provided in this policy.
- D. This policy is intended to be consistent with the following three Internal Revenue Service requirements:
 - 1) There must be a business connection and the expense must be reasonable.
 - 2) There must be a reasonable accounting for the expenses by the traveler.

3) All excess reimbursements must be repaid in a reasonable time.

VI. TRANSPORTATION:

The mode of transportation should reflect the most practical, cost-effective and economical method based on the requirements of the travel to include the nature and urgency of the business, the number of authorized persons making the trip and the distance to be traveled. Receipts for City vehicles, rental vehicles and other related transportation expenses are required with the Daily Business – Travel Record & Mileage Report. All attempts must be made to obtain a City vehicle before using a privately-owned vehicle.

A. City Vehicles:

- 1) For other than out-of-town travel, City vehicles should be used whenever possible for ground transportation to and from the destination subject to mileage concerns or other considerations.
- 2) Any expenses incurred in conjunction with the use of a City vehicle must be documented with a receipt.
- 3) Family members or other non-business riders are not permitted.

B. Privately Owned Vehicles:

- 1) Use of an employee's privately owned vehicle may be authorized by a Department Head/Constitutional Officer if other means of transportation are not feasible or where the City's convenience is best served by this type of transportation. Employees electing to use their personal vehicle as a matter of convenience will be reimbursed for mileage at the applicable IRS published rate.: https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rates.
- 2) Reimbursement of private vehicle expenses is at the standard mileage rate for actual and necessary miles traveled, plus self-parking and tolls when documented by itemized receipts. The standard mileage rate will be posted on IRS website: https://www.irs.gov/tax-professionals/standard-mileage-rates.
- 3) For local travel within the City when travel is from home directly to the destination without going to the normal worksite, the number of miles to the normal worksite must be deducted from the reimbursement request.
- 4) No traveler shall be allowed either mileage or transportation expense when transported by another traveler who is entitled to mileage or transportation expense.

5) Any privately-owned vehicle used on City business must be insured to at least the minimum liability amounts required under the law of the state in which the vehicle is registered.

C. Rental Vehicles:

- 1) The use of a rental vehicle must be justified as an economical need and not a matter of personal convenience. Car rental charges will not be reimbursed if shuttle service is available and no business necessity exists for a rental vehicle. The City will not pay for the use of a rental car to accommodate family or non-business associates traveling with the employee. Non-City employees are not covered under the City's insurance policy. When traveling together, employees should share cars to minimize costs. Travelers must select the most economical rental vehicle contractor and type of vehicle available. A larger car may be selected only if it is available at the same rate as the compact, if it is the lowest class available, or if it is required to transport a group of City travelers.
- 2) City employees should not accept optional insurance for collision and comprehensive coverage offered by the car rental agency. The insurance carried by the City covers rental cars. An exception to purchasing the additional insurance would be when statutorily required to do so such as during the transport of prisoners. Please check with your Department Head/Constitutional Officer prior to renting a vehicle in the course of City business.
- 3) The traveler must ensure that the rental vehicle is refueled before returning the vehicle to the rental contractor to avoid costly refueling charges. The traveler should not enter into a "Fuel Agreement" or pay for fuel at the time of rental.
- 4) The traveler must submit original gasoline expense receipts, and the original rental car receipt as documentation with the Daily Business Travel Record & Mileage Report.
- 5) No additional transportation charges such as taxicabs will be reimbursable during the time that a rental car is obtained.

D. Commercial Aircraft:

- 1) Aircraft may be used when this has been determined to be the most economical and feasible means of travel. When a trip is over 200 miles and air transportation is available, the feasibility of traveling by air should be considered.
- 2) Commercial air transportation rates should not exceed those for economy or coach class. The use of fares purchased in advance is encouraged for all travel.
- 3) If the cost of air travel is paid for personally by the traveler, a copy of the paid ticket or other itemized receipt must be provided for reimbursement.

4) Where an employee is averse to flying, this section is not to be construed as imposing the obligation to use aircraft travel. However, the travel reimbursement will be limited to the amount of the lowest standard economy commercial airfare available between the points of travel unless the selected method of travel results in a lower amount to be reimbursed. Reimbursement will not be made for any lodging or other costs en route related to the use of a privately-owned vehicle or other type of commercial carrier in this instance.

E. Parking:

Employees will be reimbursed for long-term airport parking rates only when leaving their vehicle while using air transportation. When using parking for other purposes or at other locations, only self-parking rates will be reimbursable.

F. Other:

Employees are encouraged to investigate travel by train since service is available out of Norfolk and Newport News. Employees are also encouraged to use any courtesy transportation available at the travel destination. Taxicabs and public conveyance are reimbursable when justified. Justifiable examples include: ferry fares, road and bridge tolls, bus fare, subway tolls, and parking charges. Original itemized receipts are required for reimbursement.

VII. LODGING:

- A. Expenditures for lodging should meet business needs, be reasonable and offer good value. Lodging will be reimbursed for City employees only. If the room is also occupied by a person other than a City employee, reimbursement will be at the single occupancy rate.
- B. Itemized receipts are required for reimbursement.
- C. When attending a conference, a stay at the conference or convention hotel is encouraged to avoid transportation costs. If accommodations are not available, it shall be permissible to stay in lodging with comparable overall rates when taking into consideration any potential increase in transportation or other costs.
- D. Overnight accommodations are only reimbursable if they exceed 60 miles from the employee's normal worksite and if the employee is traveling on overnight travel.
- E. If an advance is requested, the Report of Travel Expense form should be used to request the advance. This form should also be completed prior to travel when travel expenses are expected to exceed \$1,000 approved by department heads and submitted to accounts payable to encumber funds. Upon completion of travel, a completed Report of Travel Form must be completed and

approved by the authorizing department head forwarding to the Finance Department for payment withing 30 days of return.

VIII. MEALS

- A. Daily Per Diem Allowance the allowance for meals and incidentals (including tax and tip) is based on the federal Per Diem Rate Table currently effective as published by the General Services Association (www.gsa.gov/perdiem). To obtain this information, travelers are encouraged to utilize the Per Diem Calculator at http://www.perdiemcalc.net/gsa/. Using this method, receipts for meals or incidentals are not required. However, travelers do need to attach a copy of the Per Diem Calculator in effect for the period of travel.
- B. The City Purchasing Card may not be used for meals and incidentals covered by the per diem. Should the traveler inadvertently use the purchasing card for a meal, the per diem will be reduced by that amount.
- C. On the day of departure and the day of return, the traveler is entitled to a maximum of seventy-five (75%) percent of the per diem rate for that day or a lesser amount at the discretion of the Department Head or Constitutional Officer. Per diem rates are daily rates and there is no roll-over of per diem from one day to the next.
- D. No reimbursement will be made for meals included with a conference, seminar or registration fee or provided by third parties. Please use the Per Diem Calculator to notate conference-provided meals and calculate the related adjustment to the per diem rate. Reimbursement is allowable for those meals that are identified as "continental."
- E. Registration at a banquet is considered an appropriate expense for a traveler when he/she is on the program of the function or is an official representative of the City.
- F. The City discourages the practice of requesting reimbursement for meals within the local travel area. Meals in the local region are only reimbursable if the individual is specifically authorized by the Department Head or Constitutional Officer. The business purpose and identification of those in attendance must be included with the receipt.
- G. The City will not reimburse the cost of alcoholic beverages.

IX. OTHER EXPENSES

A. Miscellaneous/Incidentals

1) A daily amount of \$5.00 for incidental expenses is included in the per diem rate for overnight travel. This included personal calls home, all tips (including tips for maids, porters, bell hops,

skycaps, and taxi drivers), laundry charges and all other gratuities. Incidental charges cannot be itemized and charged to the City.

B. Communications:

- 1) A personal telephone call home is considered an incidental expense. Personal telephone calls home cannot be itemized and charge to the City.
- 2) Reasonable business-related postage, telephone, fax or internet connection charges are reimbursable with proper justification for necessary business use and require receipt for reimbursement. Please attach proper justification to the Report of Travel/Training Expenses if requesting reimbursement.

C. Registration:

1) Registration fees should be paid by the City as far in advance as possible to avoid additional charges or penalties. Department-approved registration fee payment requests are to be submitted to the Department of Finance on a voucher no later than two weeks prior to the conference. Employees may be reimbursed for approved registration fees paid out-of-pocket with the submission of a receipt. Fees for professionally-oriented field trips or other special events sponsored by a conference or seminar may be included with the registration. Optional entertainment events will not be reimbursed.

X. NON-REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES:

- A. Personal expenses will not be reimbursed by the City. Examples include, but not limited to:
 - 1) Alcoholic beverages
 - 2) Barber or salon services
 - 3) Personal entertainment such as movies, cable fees, theater, health clubs, night clubs, or bowling.
 - 4) Personal toiletry articles, medicines or other personal items
 - 5) Loss of funds or loss/damage to personal belongings
 - 6) Passports, money orders, travelers' checks
 - 7) Personal postage, reading materials, personal sight-seeing, shopping
 - 8) Non-business telephone calls
 - 9) Childcare or pet care costs
 - 10) Parking or moving violation fines, bail or legal fees
 - 11) Donations
 - 12) Medical expenses
 - 13) Personal vehicle repairs or towing
 - 14) ATM or banking service fees
 - 15) Luxury upgrades

- 16) Candy, gum, cough drops
- 17) Expenses for children, spouses and companions
- 18) All expenses related to the personal negligence of the traveler (e.g. fines, services to gain entry to a locked vehicle, etc.)

XI. OTHER:

- A. It is possible that circumstances could require a traveler to remain absent overnight when the original travel plans indicated otherwise or could require a change in mode or schedule of travel. In such cases, the traveler will notify his/her Department Head or Constitutional Officer as soon as possible. The expense voucher submitted upon return must note any revisions with an explanation.
- B. When an employee/traveler is reimbursed or is to be reimbursed for any expense of travel by other than the City, or when any expense of travel is without charge to the City, the employee/traveler shall not make claim fur such expense to the City.
- C. When a spouse accompanies a traveler on an official business trip, the City will provide reimbursement for only those expenses which the traveler would normally incur if traveling alone.
- D. When traveling out of the country, it is the responsibility of the traveler to provide contemporaneous documentation of the conversion rates when submitting their Report of Travel/Training Expenses. This information is available from the traveler's credit card statement.
- E. All travel by City Council members shall be funded directly through the travel portion of their operating budget, with the exception of travel allowances provided by regional organizations.
- F. Employees submitting travel reimbursement requests for local travel consisting of mileage, parking and/or tolls will do so on a frequency of no less than monthly. Such travel reimbursement requests are due within ten days of the end of the month for which they apply.

Background Information

As a follow up to a retreat item, please find attached a recommendation and the associated costs should Franklin City Council authorize additional contributions toward the premiums of those with the Employee Plus 1 and Employee Family plans. This has long been a deterrent for recruitment and retention of employees to the City of Franklin. We have a large number of positions throughout the City that need to be filled and hope that this will assist in our recruitment efforts.

As demonstrated by the chart below the City of Franklin is well behind other municipalities with regards to their contributions toward Employee Plus One and Employee Family.

2020 Board of Equalization Hearings

The Board of Equalization was trained via Webinar by the Department of Taxation on October 8, 2020 that was 4 ½ hours long. Since all of our board members were new to the process, we offered additional training using our maps and assessors' records prior to the hearings. The board held hearings that were advertised and open to the public in the City Hall Council Chambers on November 2, 4, 5 and 9, 2020.

There were 10 appointments which included 15 parcels. We did not have any "no shows".

The Board of Equalization made 4 changes to the 2020-2021 General Reassessment; 1 was residential and 3 were commercial properties. The total values changed are as follows:

\$157,700 - reduction in commercial \$ 1,200 - reduction in residential

There were no increases in value for commercial or residential.

The 2020 Board of Equalization has completed their hearings and all Notices of Change have been mailed and the City Treasurer notified.

I would like to thank Mr. Sion A. Carr, III, Chairman, Ms. Peggy R. Scott, Secretary, Ms. Micah N. Dillon and Mr. Ronald L. Rusnak, Alternate for their service to the City of Franklin. Also, Betty Tarkington the Real Estate Clerk, who works closely with the board during the hearing process.



Hazard Pay Stipend for Pollworkers

On October 20, 2020, the City of Franklin was awarded \$7,837.50 in grant funds by the Center for Tech and Civic Life (CTCL). CTCL is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization which received a \$250,000,000 contribution to help local election officials safely administer the November 2020 election while dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. The grant funds were meant to ensure election offices had adequate staffing, training, and equipment.

Having adequate staffing on Election Day was a major concern because without pollworkers, there would be no election. Most of our pollworkers are in the high-risk category and some chose not to work in May, June, or November because of the pandemic for fear of their own safety or that of their loved ones. We were thankfully able to recruit enough pollworkers to have a safe election, while ensuring every eligible vote was counted. It was our neighbors' devotion to democracy that made this possible.

The CTCL grant specifically states that hazard pay is an acceptable expense for pollworkers, therefore I am respectfully requesting that \$162.71 be paid to each pollworker who served during the November 3, 2020 election cycle, a total of \$7,647.37 (see attached). I would ask that you consider recommending such to the City Council.

I am pleased to inform you that based on and in reliance upon the information and materials provided by Franklin City, the Center for Tech and Civic Life ("CTCL"), a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") section 501(c)(3), has decided to award a grant to support the work of Franklin City ("Grantee").

The following is a description of the grant:

AMOUNT OF GRANT: \$7,837.50 USD

PURPOSE: The grant funds must be used exclusively for the public purpose of planning and operationalizing safe and secure election administration in Franklin City in 2020 ("Purpose").

Before CTCL transmits these funds to Grantee, CTCL requires that Grantee review and sign this agreement ("Grant Agreement") and agree to use the grant funds in compliance with the Grant Agreement and with United States tax laws and the laws and regulations of your state and jurisdiction ("Applicable Laws"). Specifically, by signing this letter Grantee certifies and agrees to the following:

- 1. Grantee is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1).
- 2. This grant shall be used only for the Purpose described above, and for no other purposes.

- 3. Grantee has indicated that the amount of the grant shall be expended on the following specific election administration needs: Ballot drop boxes, Non-partisan voter education, Personal protective equipment (PPE) for staff, poll workers, or voters, Poll worker recruitment funds, hazard pay, and/or training expenses, Temporary staffing, Vote-by-mail/Absentee voting equipment or supplies, and Election administration equipment. Grantee may allocate grant funds among those needs, or to other public purposes listed in the grant application, without further notice to or permission of CTCL.
- 4. Grantee shall not use any part of this grant to make a grant to another organization, except in the case where the organization is a local government unit or political subdivision within the meaning of IRC section 170(c)(1) or a nonprofit organization tax-exempt under IRC section 501(c)(3), and the subgrant is intended to accomplish the Purpose of this grant. Grantee shall take reasonable steps to ensure that any such subgrant is used in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement, including requiring that subgrantee agrees in writing to comply with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 5. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs may be applied to the grant. The Grantee shall expend the amount of this grant for the Purpose by December 31, 2020.
- 6. Grantee is authorized to receive this grant from CTCL and certifies that (a) the receipt of these grant funds does not violate any Applicable Laws, and (b) Grantee has taken all required, reasonable and necessary steps to receive, accept and expend the grant in accordance with the Purpose and Applicable Law.
- 7. The Grantee shall produce a brief report explaining and documenting how grant funds have been expended in support of the activities described in paragraph 3. This report shall be sent to CTCL no later than January 31, 2021 in a format approved by CTCL and shall include with the report a signed certification by Grantee that it has complied with all terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement.
- 8. This grant may not supplant previously appropriated funds. The Grantee shall not reduce the budget of the General Registrar ("the Election Department") or fail to appropriate or provide previously budgeted funds to the Election Department for the term of this grant. Any amount supplanted, reduced or not provided in contravention of this paragraph shall be repaid to CTCL up to the total amount of this grant.
- 9. CTCL may discontinue, modify, withhold part of, or ask for the return all or part of the grant funds if it determines, in its sole judgment, that (a) any of the above terms and conditions of this grant have not been met, or (b) CTCL is required to do so to comply with applicable laws or regulations.
- 10. The grant project period of June 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020 represents the dates between which covered costs for the Purpose may be applied to the grant.

Re: Staffing Increase

Dear Mrs. Jarratt,

I have completed my first year as Chief of Emergency Services and my 13th year with Franklin Fire & Rescue. This year has been unprecedented and full of challenges for our citizens and government. I truly believe if we continue to prepare for and be proactive there is nothing we cannot accomplish. I have evaluated the overall effectiveness of Franklin Fire & Rescue's operation and I have determined we are beginning to see staffing challenges. Due to the increase demand for an engine response on high priority, emergency medical services (EMS) calls, and a significant reduction in volunteerism. We are having challenges meeting the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1720, Staffing and Response.

The last staffing increase we received was in 2012, we added an additional nine Firemen. With ten years almost around the corner, I feel we need to begin preparing for increasing staffing levels. To meet our future needs and stay compliant with NFPA 1720, we need to add an additional 12 Firemen.

We have several options to consider:

- Adding 3 additional Firemen for the next four years
- Adding 6 additional Firemen every two years
- Adding 12 additional Firemen
- Applying for a SAFER Grant and if awarded adding all 12 Firemen.

The objectives of the SAFER grant program are to assist local fire departments with staffing and deployment capabilities to respond to emergencies and assure that communities have adequate protection from fire and fire-related hazards. Local fire departments accomplish this by improving staffing and deployment capabilities, so they may more effectively and safely respond to emergencies. With enhanced staffing levels, recipients should experience a reduction in response times and an increase in the number of trained personnel assembled at the incident scene.

I feel that adding additional 3 per year would be the best approach to meet the Departments need, and apply for the SAFER grant as a supplemental funding source.

I would like to thank you in advance for your consideration. Please let me know if you have any concerns or questions.

Francis III Chief of Emergency Services SAFER grants provide funding directly to fire departments and volunteer firefighter interest organizations to help them increase or maintain the number of trained, "front line" firefighters available in their communities. The goal of SAFER is to enhance local fire departments' abilities to comply with staffing, response and operational standards established by the NFPA (NFPA 1710 and/or NFPA 1720).

Cost Share (Waiver Available) Under the SAFER Hiring of Firefighters Activity, grant recipients are required to contribute a Cost Share toward the actual cost of hiring firefighters under this program. The Federal portion of the costs of hiring firefighters under this grant may not exceed:

- 75 percent of the actual costs incurred in each of the first and second years of the grant; and 35 percent of the actual costs incurred in the third year of the grant.
- Therefore, the recipient is required to contribute at least the following in non-Federal funds:
- 25 percent of the actual costs incurred in each of the first and second years of the grant; and 65 percent of the actual costs incurred in the third year of the grant.
- A Cost Share of non-federal cash is the only allowable recipient contribution. Grant recipients can apply to waive this requirement.
